Planning Priority #1

To teach our students about the connection between their emotions/actions and to support the development of healthy relationships in the school community and beyond.

Strategies;

- We will support/teach students to identify and regulate their emotions, using a number of effective strategies.
- Promote positive ways of being at school with school wide incentives, social skills training and the new Sportsmanship support role.
- Nurture positive relationships with a school wide check-in first thing in the morning, and a focus on effective listening/problem solving and repairing, when harm is done.

Planning Priority #2

To promote academic success that is enhanced by the eight learning competencies.

Strategies;

- Our focus this year is on "Pandemic Recovery", so all students will be able to catch up on the learning they have missed.
- All teachers will learn about the importance of teaching students about phonemic awareness through professional learning sessions with the HSD reading clinician.
- We have added a Numeracy support teacher in the school and also have access to a divisional Numeracy expert to help us support students in Numeracy and build teacher capacity.

Planning Priority #3

To work together with all members of the parent and school community to help our students experience "The Good Life". Strategies;

- Present components of "The Good Life" to all staff and parents for awareness, discussion and planning purposes.
- Build a school based team to develop an application for the Teacher's Idea Fund provincial grant, to explore ways to support our student's relationship with nature.
- Support the health and well-being of all staff so they have the resilience and energy to provide the best possible school experience for the students.
